SELLING YOUR HOME?

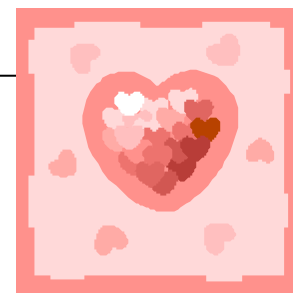

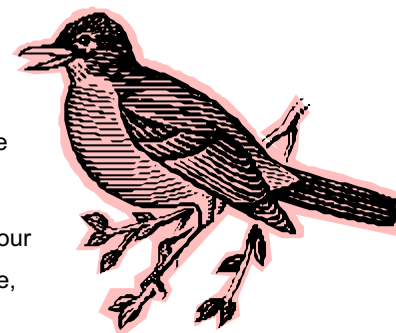
